What is the difference between Equal Pay and Gender Pay Gap?

Equal pay is ensuring that women and men are paid equally, for like for like work, work of equal value or work which is rated as equivalent. There has been legislation in place in the United Kingdom for over 50 years which is now covered by the Equality Act 2010.

Gender pay gap shows the differences in average pay between women and men in an organisation. This calculation does not take into account the work an individual does.

Why are we publishing this data?

Under the Equality Act 2010 (Gender Pay gap Information) Regulations 2017 all employers in the private or voluntary sectors with over 250 employees are required to publish gender pay gap information.

What is required to be published?

The below Gender Pay Gap Reporting Metrics are to be published each year

- Mean Gender Pay Gap
- Median Gender Pay Gap
- Mean Bonus Pay
- Median Bonus Pay
- Percentage of staff receiving a bonus
- Pay Quartiles

The above are all based on a “snapshot date” which as an organisation operating in the voluntary sector is 05 April each year and the data contained in this report is based on 05 April 2020.



Key Definitions and Terms

Gender Pay Gap Metric / Term	Definition
Mean Gender Pay Gap	The difference between the average hourly rates for women and men
Median Gender Pay Gap	The difference between the middle hourly rate for women and men
Mean Bonus Pay	The difference between the actual bonus paid to women and men
Median Bonus Pay	The difference between the middle bonus value for women and men
Percentage Receiving a Bonus	The percentage of women and men who received a bonus
Pay Quartiles	All hourly rates in the business are divided into four equal sized groups of employees and the percentage of women and men in each quartile
Snapshot Date	The date on which all information and calculations for Gender Pay Gap are based on. This is 05 April each year
Relevant Employee	A person who is employed by the relevant employer on the snapshot date
Full Pay Relevant Employee	A relevant employee who is not, during the relevant pay period, being paid at a lower rate or nil as a result of the employee being on leave

KAL Data

At the snapshot date of 05 April 2020 there were a total of 643 'relevant employees'; of this group, 610 employees were classed as being 'full pay relevant employees'.

The difference between these two figures is due to employees who were absent from work due to maternity leave and sickness where the employee was on reduced pay. In addition, this figure includes casual employees who did not receive any payment for the snapshot period as they had not worked in the relevant period.
